The conference will take place on Wednesday 2nd and Thursday 3d June 2010 and will be hosted by the Duisenberg school of finance (Amsterdam). The seminar seeks to bring together first-rate current research on "systemic bank crisis prevention and resolution" and their implications in terms of banking regulation and banks' claimholders rights.

Up to twelve papers will be selected and suitable topics may include, but are not limited to:

1. Efficient bankruptcy procedures
 - i. Prompt corrective action
 - ii. Claimholders rights (Reverse convertibles, Debt-Equity Swaps)
 - iii. Good bank/bad bank schemes
 - iv. Living wills
2. Efficient banks' rescue operations
 - i. Capital insurance
 - ii. Liquidity insurance
 - iii. Lender of last resort operations
 - iv. State aid
 - v. International rescue operations of cross-border banks and burden sharing

We invite individuals wishing to submit papers for consideration to send their paper by March 15th, 2010.

The conference will be complemented by a PhD summer school on Dysfunctional Finance, organized by Enrico Perotti and sponsored by DSF.
